#### The Music..The Dance..A Personal View #6

Man...did we have fun at SOS, my couple friends said I was almost illegal. The greatest lesson I learned at SOS this year was to run with friends that had a billfold. I just could never find mine...thanks friends. Even when I had mine, it seemed

there was never enough money for Carole also to eat...bless her little heart.

We can never recognize givers enough. So much work by so many with diverse talents with a giving spirit in my opinion is what makes a shag club. Givers are fewer than takers. A club with just takers always struggle. That is true of a church or any volunteer origination. The rules are the same. I really appreciate those that get the news out. Susan and others are amazing at what and how they do it. I know I speak for the club in wanting to thank Robin Bivins for all she does. I once thought she was flirting with me, someone told me to get over it, she treats everyone good. Every time I see her she is carrying 2 things, a big smile and a camera. In one of the parade pictures on the web, there she was with her big smile and camera. Thanks Robin for being an ambassador of love and what a treasure you are to all of us.

Sub-title for May: Boogie & Blues...for the sake of space, I will call it B & B. Not rhythm and blues, not boogie woogie, definitely not blues or soul. As always, I don't claim to know more than anyone else, in fact the internet is full of information for those interested in the music and artist. Many DJ's that love this music also have great knowledge. Along with everyone reading this, we all have an opinion; I have the privilege sharing mine. If you go to answers.com with the question...what is shag

music? The introduction states " shag music is also called beach music or beach pop. It came into existence during the 50's and 60's and consisted of various pop and rock music. This kind of music was closely associated with a style of swing dancing that was known as the Carolina shag. Shag music has a much deeper back-story and meaning than you'd expect." That is what interest me, the back-story or the why's, the how's, the where's, the stories of the old black artist.

I thought this was a good article for those interested in more information. This music we all love and dance to is also called jump blues, juk'n, classic 60's soul and beach, boogie chillen, juke joint rhythm & blues, beach band music along with my favorite B & B.

My question is "what dance music turns you on and why"? I happen to have a top 10 reasons why I love B&B beginning with #10makes my skin vibrate and gets the wrinkles out #9-causes me to want to run naked through the woods screaming "Geronimo" #8-makes me feel cool when I know I'm not #7- causes me to dance faster than I need to #6- makes me feel 16 again #5- causes me to eat more chicken?? #4- causes me to love Joyce Kincaid plus everybody else #3- makes my high blood pressure fun #2- huntin music all night more restful than sleepin. And the #1 reason I love B&B..Carole loves it too. There is a reason for my reasons...I had nothing to say about sounding good.

For me, music is more about emotion. Many people only listen with the ear, boogie crazies like James and me listen with their whole being. He's crazy, that's the reason I love him. Many of these old B&B artist were so boogie crazy, they would play their pianos and harmonicas for nothing in the old clubs, especially in Chicago, Louisiana and Memphis. In fact a musical style of B&B was called Chicago Boogie Piano music. Many artist couldn't read and would sign contracts with

record companies and producers and were only paid pennies as others became wealthy off their music. Many died broke. It was the emotion and love of the music. Some of the music didn't sound that great but it was in my opinion some of the greatest shag music ever recorded. Case in point...one of my top 10 favorite shag songs "If That's Your Girl" is from early 50's by a black artist named Boyd Gilmore 1910-1976. The old piano is way out of tune, he can't hardly sing...but man, when I crank it up, I go crazy, it is emotional to me. For those that have my B&B Favorites CD #2, it is song #6. Thanks to the great DJ and my friend Donnie Meadows for sharing this great song. As soon as I get a new song, I jump on the website and get the history behind the artist and song if available...I love it.

I have often wondered why I love this music so much knowing I am in a minority. If you go to any favorites music list...WSGE 91.7 Top Beach 25, Judy's House of Oldies, Top Smokin 45's, even the Association of Beach and Shag Club DJ's Top 50 songs requested, to name a few, less than 10 counted could be called B&B. I think this music takes me back to 12-13 years old when I would get on the bus in Conover and ride to the record store in Newton to buy Jerry Lee Lewis records. No one was more emotional than Jerry Lee. Being a entrepreneur for 45 years and in personal sales for past 25 years, I began to read books on emotional involvement and moving people toward making a good decision. The greatest thing I learned and see daily is this fact "people buy, join things and are moved more by emotion than logic." Hopefully logic or reason will be the end result but the first move was emotional. We are spiritual beings currently

living in a body of flesh. The flesh is emotional or even weak according to The Word and it can be easily motivated. Case in point, I have been in many worship services and after repeating the last verse multiple times of a favorite old invitational hymn "Just As I Am" someone finally moves out and walks the isle. Then another moves, another and another. Did they finally hear the song message or were they emotionally moved by others. We know the logic of the seed being sowed on different types of soil would not mean all accepted the message but many were moved.

I was emotionally moved over a year ago when I went to Lake Norman to buy a black Hyundai Elantra. After they cranked up a black Sonata with dual exhaust in 20 degree temperatures, the memory of my 1955 T-Bird with smoking dual exhaust hit me. Money didn't enter my mind. After signing the papers, the logic of more money set in. It was emotional involvement that put me in the seat.

Whatever dance music moves you emotionally, makes you feel good and even sounds good, if it allows you to enjoy it with special people, moves you to the dance floor, give thanks and know where the foundation of music came from. As Gloria Gaither wrote in one of her greatest songs "You ask me why my heart keeps singing, why I can sing when things go wrong, but since I've found the source of music, I just can't help it. God gave the song."
