“SHORT” Stories—by Alan Brown

A BFF's perspective of my friend--your friend--our friend--**Deanes G. Short**

We lost a big part of the heart and soul of SBSC on Sept. 17, 2012. I readily agreed to write some words about my best friend and long time cohort but as I sit here typing it is much harder than I thought -- in fact it just sucks :(So many stories, escapades, great times, etc. have either flashed through my head or been recounted to me since the funeral that it is hard to begin to do Deanes justice. So I have decided to write a series of "Short" stories over the next few newsletters. I would also encourage any of you that have a story or anecdote to please share with me by email or post them to the SBSC Facebook site for all to enjoy. I have talked with Robin and John about putting some of these thoughts together for an article in next Spring's SOS Carefree Times paper, so please help and correct my failing memory if need be. Many of you were not able to be at the funeral service so I may repeat some of those stories.

Well here goes!! Now Short really knew how to tell a tale and especially bend the facts more than a little to make it sound good or make me look bad to get a point across. According to him he gave me the name DowntownAlanBrown, that I had been demoted from Uptown but mostly he wished I was Out-of-town! At times we would fight like cats and dogs, if I said white, he would say black, etc. But he would always have my back and vice versa. So I'm gonna stick to the facts. Deanes had a certain passion for life and whatever he was into; sports, shagging, gambling, Carolina Tarheels, like no one I have ever known. I first got a glimpse of the "legend" at the old Nursery ball field because my Dad used to keep score for the City of Morganton fast-pitch league and he sponsored his team---Short's Used Cars. They had been State champs in the '70s but this was in the '80s. Sometime in the late '80s both Deanes and I joined Mimosa Golf Club. We got paired up one day to play by the Pro Danny Dobson (soon to be one of our "rat pack"). We recognized each other but that was about it. As we warmed up on the 1st tee he turned to me and said, "so what are we playing for?" I said "what?" I thought this was for fun! Short says, "well here's \$5 bucks, I'll loan it to you and we'll play for it, I don't like to play unless I got a little somethin goin' on" So I said "ok". Of course Short was a lot better golfer than me but he told me he was just starting out at Mimosa!

That wasn't a lie but I didn't know he had played mucho golf @ Quaker Meadows. Anyway he proceeded to thrash me pretty good on the front nine so I pressed him (that's a new bet) and by the time we finished 18 holes I was pretty frustrated 'cause I owed him \$25!! That was the start of a true friendship though. I learned a valuable lesson to quote him again, "it's not how you play--it's how you bet!" I also started to understand his passion, makeup and enthusiasm--he was loads of fun to be around and we started playing regularly, I vowed to get my \$\$ back! It was at about that same time, around '87-'88 that we started taking shag lessons, Deanes and Debbie in Drexel at the Community Center and Gayle and I in Hickory at Khakis in the old Ramada Inn.....now that's where the fun really started.....to be continued.....I hope.

T.H.U.S.—by Gary Barlow


